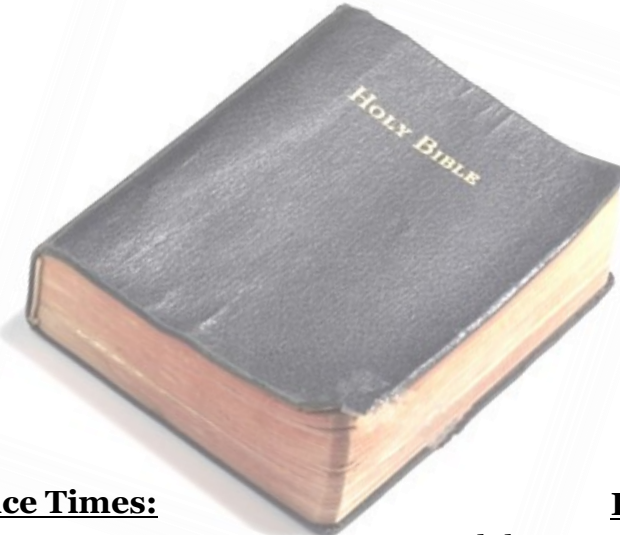

HOW GOOD MEN SEE THEMSELVES

Frist, I want you to see Job and what God said about him. Job was a *“perfect and an upright man, one that feareth God, and escheweth evil”* (Job.1:8).

Yet, when Job saw God he could say only this: *“Then Job answered the Lord, and said, Behold, I am vile; what shall I answer thee? I will lay my hand upon my mouth”* (Job 40:3-4).

It is amazing that you read about men who were faithful and yet confessed as being not so good.

Abraham who is said to be the father of the faithful, (Romans 4:11). Yet when he came to talk with God Abraham said that he was *“but dust and ashes”* (Genesis 18:27).
