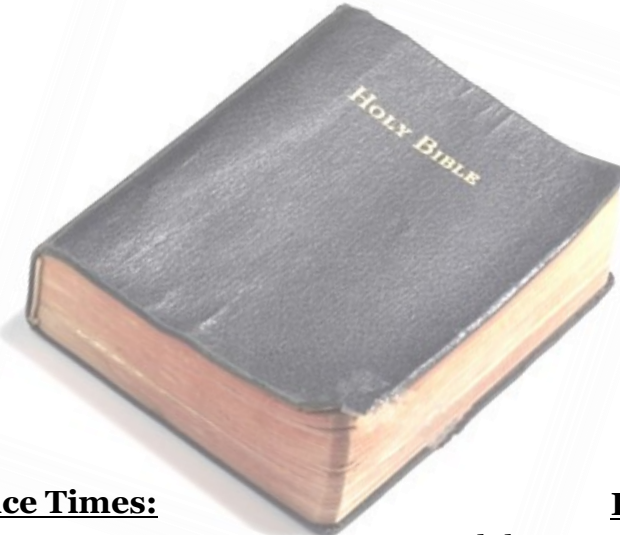

THE CAPTIAN OF OUR SALVATION

“For it became him, for whom are all things, and by whom are

all things, in bringing many sons unto glory, to make the captain of their salvation perfect through sufferings” (Hebrews 2:10).

There has always been someone in charge to give the command as to what to do and how to do it.

In the Old Testament we have these words given to Joshua. *“Have not I commanded thee? Be strong and of a good courage; be not afraid, neither be thou dismayed: for the Lord thy God is with thee whithersoever thou goest.10 Then Joshua commanded the officers of the people, saying, 11 Pass through the host, and command the people, saying, Prepare you victuals; for within three days ye shall pass over this Jordan, to go in to possess the land, which the Lord your God giveth you to possess it”* (Joshua 1:9-11).

In this you can see that Joshua received a command through Moses and then Joshua gave a command to officers. There has to be a system of responsibility and there must be loyalty to the Lord that comes through a rec-

ognized chain of command.

It is true in regard to the organization of the church, the plan of salvation, how we are to worship God and live our lives acceptable to our heavenly Father.

If we neglect the commands then we are out of order and therefore nothing will be according to the plan given. As we noted earlier Christ is our Captain and therefore He is in charge, and we must obey his commands.

If we follow the orders, we are good soldiers, if not then we are disobedient. Whatever we are called to do we must be willing to do and endure. Paul said:

“Thou therefore endure hardness, as a good soldier of Jesus Christ.

No man that warreth entangleth himself with the affairs of this life; that he may please him who hath chosen him to be a soldier” (2 Timothy 2:3-4).
