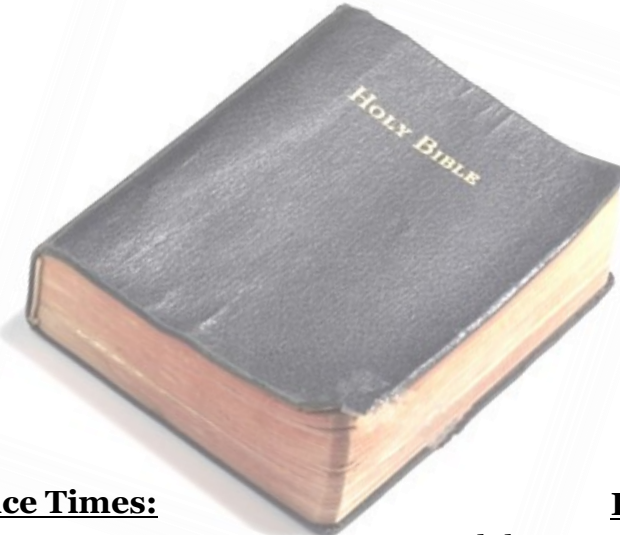

Mesa or Mountain

Matthew 5:43-48

“Ye have heard that it hath been said, Thou shalt love thy neighbor, and hate thine ene-

my. 44 But I say unto you, Love your enemies, bless them that curse you, do good to them that hate you, and pray for them which despitefully use you, and persecute you; 45 That ye may be the children of your Father which is in heaven: for he maketh his sun to rise on the evil and on the good, and sendeth rain on the just and on the unjust. 46 For if ye love them which love you, what reward have ye? do not even the publicans the same? 47 And if ye salute your brethren only, what do ye more than others? do not even the publicans so? 48 Be ye therefore perfect, even as your Father which is in heaven is perfect.”

Near Boulder, Colorado, is a steep and narrow mountain trail to “Royal Arch,” where one can see Denver, or towns

to the north. Northeast of Boulder is a lake once called Mesa Lake, which is bordered on the north by a wide mesa.

These two natural sites show us two possible conditions in our spiritual life. One may be on the mesa, secure in God's grace, yet not doing anything challenging for God and not obtaining the maximum spiritual blessing possible. Another may be spiritually climbing as one climbs a physical mountain, growing in God's grace and strength each day.

“You are to be perfect” reminds us that only God is perfect and that Jesus showed us how far we are from the peak of spiritual perfection. We should also be challenged that, in God's strength and grace, we can be moving ever upward in our Christian life, rather than remaining on the mesa of missed opportunities and blessings.
