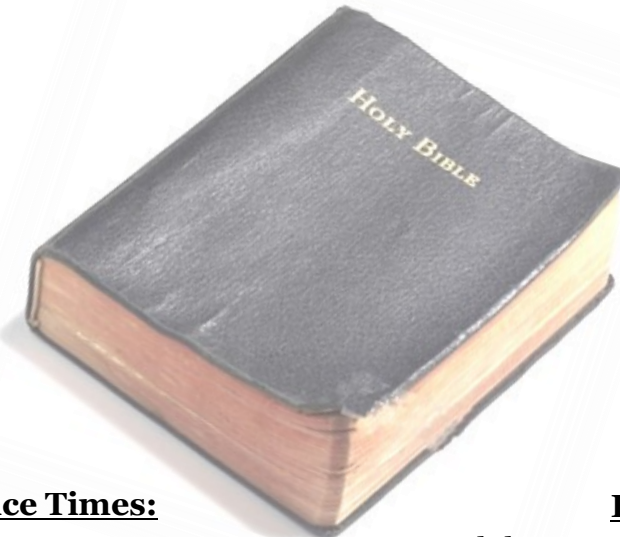

“Behold Your King”

“Lift up your heads, O ye gates; and be ye lifted up, ye everlasting doors: and the King of glory will come in” (Psalms 24:7.)

When Pilate asked Jesus, “Art thou a king?” he said, “To this end have I been born.” But the Jews rejected his claim.

They accused him of being a threat to Caesar. Pilate brought

him out and presented him to the Jews saying, “Behold your king!” They cried, “Away with him, crucify him!” Pilate said, “Shall I crucify your king?” The chief priests answered, “We have no king but Caesar.”

They rejected their rightful king and pretended to be loyal to Caesar. Yet, Pilate wrote a title for the cross: JESUS OF NAZARETH, THE KING OF THE JEWS.

Whether he sensed that Jesus was what he claimed to be, or, whether he did this to taunt the Jews, he still stated divine truth.

Behold your king! We may not own him as king, but his claims are valid just the same. We may call him Lord, and refuse to let him rule our lives.

God crowned him king of Kings and Lord of lords, but we must personally crown him king of our lives and let him have his way with us. “Behold your king!” “Bring forth the royal diadem, And crown him Lord of all!” the song says.
